

# Directions by plane

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If you plan to go to the Dutch Rhoenrad Summercamp by plane, the most common airports to arrive are Schiphol Airport in Amsterdam, Eindhoven Airport in Eindhoven and Weeze Airport near Dusseldorf. With the directions given you should be able to find your way from the airport to Ede-Wageningen.

## Schiphol Airport

Go to the train station which is indicated on the airport. You have to buy a one-way ticket to Ede-Wageningen. Take the train to Utrecht. It will take about 40 minutes to get to Utrecht where you have to switch trains. The train to Ede-Wageningen will usually leave from platform 14 and has final destination Nijmegen. It takes approximately half an hour from Utrecht to get to Ede-Wageningen.

## Eindhoven Airport

Take the bus from the airport to the central station, the correct busses are number 103, 145 or 401. If you arrive early in the morning or late in the evening, check if the busses will leave on time. You can buy tickets in the bus. At the central station you have to buy a trainticket to station Ede-Wageningen. You can do this at a yellow and blue vending machine or at a desk. Buy a one-way ticket. Then take the train to Utrecht, those trains normally leave from platform 5 and will have final destination Schiphol or Alkmaar. Utrecht is usually announced on the display at the platform. If not, ask someone. Arrival is in 50 minutes, you have to switch trains. Take the train in direction Nijmegen, which normally leaves from platform 14. It will take approximately another 30 minutes to get to Ede-Wageningen.

## Weeze Airport

Although Weeze Airport is announced to be close to Dusseldorf, do not take a taxi to the Central Station of Dusseldorf. It is much faster to take a shuttlebus to Arnhem. At Arnhem Central Station you buy a one-way ticket to Ede-Wageningen. The train to Ede-Wageningen has final destination Utrecht Centraal and it will take approximately 10 to 15 minutes to get to Ede-Wageningen.

# Directions by train

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If you arrive in the Netherlands with an international train, it is most likely you arrive in Utrecht, Arnhem or in Schiphol. The train from the south (Brussels/Paris) also stops in Rotterdam and Amsterdam Central, but then it is best to get out at Schiphol Airport.

## **From Schiphol**

At Schiphol you have to buy a one-way ticket to Ede-Wageningen. Take the train to Utrecht. It will take about 40 minutes to get to Utrecht where you have to change trains. The train to Ede-Wageningen will leave usually from platform 14 and has final destination Nijmegen. From Utrecht it takes approximately half an hour to get to Ede-Wageningen.

## **From Arnhem**

At Arnhem Central Station you buy a one-way ticket to Ede-Wageningen. The train to Ede-Wageningen will have final destination Utrecht Centraal and it will take approximately 10 to 15 minutes to get to Ede-Wageningen.

## **From Utrecht**

You have to buy a one-way ticket to Ede-Wageningen. The train to Ede-Wageningen will usually leave from platform 14 and has final destination Nijmegen. From Utrecht it takes approximately half an hour to get to Ede-Wageningen.

## **From the south (Utrecht/Arnhem A12-E35)**

Take exit 24 in the direction of Ede (Dr. W. Dreeslaan). Go right at the end of the exit (with traffic lights) At the third traffic light, go left. (Laan der Verenigde Naties). Go straight on the first and second roundabout. Go left on the third roundabout, and left on the fourth. The road turns right, after this corner is the sports hall.

## **From the north (Barneveld A1-A30)**

Take the A12 in direction Arnhem, then follow directions under "From the south".

## **From the north (Apeldoorn N304)**

At the traffic lights you go straight on Raadhuisstraat, this becomes Klinkerbergerweg and eventually Bennekomseweg. After you have driven under the railway, go left at the traffic lights (in direction motorway, Jan Th. Tooroplaan). Go straight on the first roundabout (Laan der Verenigde Naties). Also straight on the second and third roundabout. Go left on the fourth roundabout, and on the fifth. The road turns right, after this corner is the sports hall.
